Regulate it!

Steps to protect kids from marijuana social consumption¹





- Marijuana-free zones²
 - a 1,000 feet from schools, preschools, daycare centers and youth-serving facilities³
 - **b** 1,000 feet from public parks and recreation centers
 - c 500 feet from residences, residential use
 - d Main entrance signage
- Prohibit the sale and social consumption of marijuana edibles⁴
- Reduce sales limits⁵
- Limit hours of operation⁶



Regulate it!





- **5** Limit outlet density and total number of licenses⁷
- 6 Limit industry advertising; no outdoor or billboard advertising⁸
- 7 Local enforcement of regularly scheduled checks of age restrictions⁹
- Track adverse events through mandatory reporting by licensees
